#### **Our Mission**

As a ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Easton, the mission of Camp Wright is the spiritual and physical development of youth through living, recreating, learning, singing and praying gin an environment that promotes leadership and individual growth.

#### The Camp Wright Experience

Camp Wright is an American Camp Association accredited camp. We use the ACA professional practices and standards to enhance the quality of our program and are reviewed every three years. Campers stay in rustic cabins with 7-9 other campers and at least 2 staff members. Cabins do no have electricity so don't forget a flashlight! Showers and toilets are located in a central bathhouse. Campers eat meals in cabin groups in the Dining Hall and end each meal with table cheers. We begin and end each day with song, stories, reflection, and prayer during Devotion and time is set aside each day for Serendipity, our Christian Education program. Through art, activities, stories, games, and music we grow in our ability to love our neighbors as ourselves.

### **Resident Camp Programs**

#### Traditional Sessions (RC 1, 2, 3, 4, 5) \$650

For campers who are 7-14 years old.

These sessions provide a week of fun and friendship! Campers choose their own adventure: sports, boating, drama, dance, archery, arts & crafts, and more. Evenings are reserved for fun large group events such as Counselor Hunt and a day of Blue-White activities.

#### Mini Camps (MINI 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6) \$275

For campers who are 6-10 years old.

Mini Sessions are a great way for younger campers to get introduced to the traditions and fun of our resident camp program. Campers will enjoy two days and two nights of swimming, crafts, nature, and more.

#### Christmas Session (XMAS) \$650

For campers who are 7-14 years old.

Campers will enjoy all the fun of our week-long traditional sessions and celebrate Christmas in July! Highlights include a late night vespers service, a visit from Santa, and many other fun holiday activities.

#### STEM Camp (STEM) \$650

For campers who have completed grades 5-7.

Campers will explore science, technology, engineering, and math through hands-on activities, experiential learning, and problem solving using teamwork.

#### Nature Camp (NATURE) \$565

For campers who have completed grades 3-6.

Nature campers will explore the ecology of the Chesapeake Bay by boating, examining natural surroundings, and learning about conservation. This session includes off-site day trips to forests and waterways throughout Maryland.

#### **Camper Health Safety and Behavior**

A licensed nurse, EMT or physician is on-site 24 hours a day during resident camp. All program staff are certified in First Aid, CPR, and AED. Campers are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that is conducive to our programming, mission, and goals. Behavior that is deemed dangerous, inappropriate, or unmanageable by the administrative staff is grounds for dismissal from camp. Parents will be contacted as needed.

#### Senior Camp (SENIOR) \$550

For campers who have completed grades 6-10.

A flexible schedule, small group discussions, explorations of faith and activities geared towards older campers make this session a perfect balance of fun and growth.

## Senior High Leadership (SHL) \$715

For campers who have completed grades 9-11.

For many, this is the first step in the process of becoming a Counselor in Training. A trip to a ropes course for teambuilding, a community service project, and planning programs for our Mini campers allow participants to practice leadership in a fun, supportive environment.



For campers who have completed grades 9-11.

#### Adventure Camp (ADV) \$770

For campers who have completed grades 7-9.

These sessions include a multi-day backpacking trip on the Appalachian Trail, cooking over an open fire, tent camping, whitewater rafting, zip lining and more! Campers will be put in leadership roles, exposed to new experiences and ultimately discover more about themselves.
